My Lord,

W. Simeon Lord, Merchant of Sydney, having freighted the ship Boyd, W. John Thompson Master, to convey a Cargo of Timber & Coals from hence to the Cape of Good Hope, with which he has been supplied by this Government – and for which he is to send back a quantity of Cape Wine, in exchange, I beg leave to recommend W. Thompson to Your Lordship's Protection, as I conceive the opening and encouraging a commercial intercourse between the Cape of Good Hope and New South Wales – to be a measure likely to prove of some convenience to the former Colony, and which cannot fail of being highly conducive to the prosperity of the latter-
