Newcastle 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1814

Sir

Inclosed you will receive for the information of His Excellency the Governor Bill of Lading for the Cargo of the Estremina(?) together with the usual monthly returns –

You will please inform His Excellency that on the 1<sup>st</sup> January Samuel Hog(?), one of the Landholders up this river, was unfortunately drowned whilst bathing having got entangled in the weeds – I have secured what little he had & intend to pay some few debts he owed [ ] with it – there is a crop of Corn standing on the farm which is a good piece of ground & I want to know what shall be done with it –

You will learn by the Estremina the unfortunate – late(?) fate of the Governor Hunter, she having been wrecked in a Gale of wind on the opposite shore – luckily no lives were lost – all her rigging &c. has [ ] been saved – I am now again much [ ] for Boats, having lost my best one with the above Vessel – by this opportunity proceed to Sydney - Mary Kidmore(?) on pap(?) – Mich. Riley(?) Patrick & N. Barry – sentences expired –
