Shipped by the Grace of god, in good order and well-conditioned, by order of His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales in and upon the good Ship called the Baring whereof is Master, under God, for this present voyage, Jn. Lamb and now riding at Anchor in Sydney Cove and by God's Grace bound for Calcutta.....to say, Fifty Tons of Coals.

Being marked and numbered as in the Margin, and are to be delivered in the like good Order and well-conditioned, at the aforesaid Port of Calcutta, or as near thereto as the said Ship can with safety proceed up the river [        ] (*the Act of God, the King's Enemies, Fire, and all and every other Dangers and Accidents of the Seas, Rivers, and Navigation, of whatever Nature and Kind soever, save Risk of Boats, so far as Ships are liable thereto, excepted*), unto His Excellency The Governor General of Bengal or to his Assigns, he or they paying Freight for the said Coals after the same rate as on former occasions. \_\_\_\_\_

With Primage and Average accustomed. In Witness whereof the Master or Purser of the said Ship hath affirmed to Three Bills of Lading, all of this tenor and Date; the One of which Three Bills of Lading being accomplished, the other Two to stand Void. And so God send the good Ship to her desired Port in Safety. *Amen*. Dated in Sydney New South Wales this Thirtieth day of October in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & Fifteen
