18th July 1816

Sir,

By the arrival of the Lady Nelson on the 1st Inst. I had the pleasure of receiving your first communication as Commandant of Newcastle, bearing date 25th Inst. and accompanied by Bill of Lading, the usual Returns and a Demand for sundry Stores.

The Demand for Stores has been put into the hands of the Deputy Comm. Genl. With instructions to furnish you by the earliest opportunity with the various Items, so far as they can be supplied from the Kings Stores. – In making Acquisitions or Demands for the future I beg to suggest to you the Propriety of specifying the quantity of each Article Required. Your late Demand was incomplete in this respect.-

This will be delivered to you by Thos. Rose Master of the New Government Brig the Elizabeth Henrietta which Vessel is now dispatched on her first Voyage for a cargo of Coals & Cedar.

Both these Articles being very much Required here, You will please to cause the Elizabeth Henrietta to be laden and dispatched hither with all possible expedition.
