Sir,

I have the honor to [ ] now be in receipt of your letters of 5,6,7,17,19,20  
& 22 Inst.(?) with their several [ ].

Having laid your Letter of the [ ] Inst.(?) before the Governor, I was  
instructed by His Excellency to inform you that he never gave permission to any persons  
to go overland to Newcastle, except the Revd. [ ]. Middleton, and that he will issue an  
order to be inserted in the [ ] Gazette prohibiting such attempts in future. –

With respect to the proceeds of the Sale of the Effects of J.T. Barker  
alluded to in your Letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> Inst.(?), you had better hand(?) the same into the  
hands of R. Campbell Esq. of George Street Sydney (who is Treasurer(?) of the Savings  
Bank) in the Name of J.T. Barker deceased whoever may hereafter obtain Letters of  
administration to his Effects from the Supreme Court, will then be entitled to receive the  
same –
