

Newcastle, 10th April 1829.

Sir, The Black Native Chief Burrogo,
commonly called Jack, that I mention in
my last as having been wounded by one
of the two Prisoners who had attempted to
make their escape from this Settlement,
died on the 27th Ult^o, and in the opinion
of Aft. Surgeon Tator, in consequence of his
Wound. I have therefore sent by this Express
the Depositions taken in this case to the
Judge Advocate to ascertain if it is his
opinion that there is sufficient proof
to bring him ^{or them} to Trial. —

I beg to know how I am in
