<b>Plot Summary</b>	Explores the idea that our perceptions are conditioned by the perspective we bring to bear. Two journalists, Dan (Kevin Bacon) and Laurie (Elizabeth Perkins), are given their own TV show ('He Said, She Said') in which they give their opposing views on various issues. Their different versions reflect their different standpoints - male and female, politically conservative and politically liberal, and so on. As they get to know each other, and become romantically involved, the events in their own relationship are presented twice, from each of their perspectives e.g. what he sees as a romantic first date is perceived by her as an awkward accidental encounter.
