<b>Plot Summary</b>	<p>In 1983, Foucault responded (in audio format) to questions about Discipline and Punish: The Birth of the Prison" (1977). Specifically, the focus was the origin of the prison system as it relates to the emergence of what he termed - 'disciplinary society.' The 18th century prisons - he contends, were based upon 17th century disciplinary institutions - mainly, schools and the army. Their social arrangement became the basis for diffused societal regimentation.
